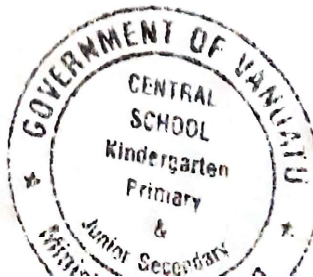
TOPIC 1. Choosing a Job

LESSON 1

Why do we need to work?

Introduction: All year 10 students are beginning to think about "What job will I do when I leave school?" Our grandfathers did not have to think about this. Why not?

1. Make a list of all the work which needs to be done in a village.
2. Why do village people work?
Through questions, show that people work
 - (a) to provide for basic needs - food, shelter etc.
 - (b) to fulfil traditional responsibilities (for marriage, etc).
 - (c) for artistic creation (carving etc).
3. Now list all the work people do in towns. Explain how work is now divided up so that only some people build houses and others pay for them, only some grow food and others buy it etc. Why do people in towns work?
 - (a) people earn money to buy basic needs - food, rent for houses, etc.
 - (b) people depend on each other - each provides one service for the community.
 - (c) for interest, creativity, satisfaction, meeting people.
 - (d) to get money for extra things (radios, school fees, etc).



(4) What would happen if you didn't work at all? (answers should include boredom, no feeling of achievement).

(5) Study Genesis 2:15
Genesis 1:26-28.

Main Points:

- (1) human beings are to care for the world, and look after other animals etc.
- (2) we are co-workers with God in caring for the world.
- (3) we all "like God" in our ability to create new things, and in being in charge of other creatures.
